

Parish Assets

Recreation Ground and Pavilion

The Recreation Ground is situated on the Upperton Road and is owned by the Parish Council. It was given to the Parish on 7th May 1927 by Lord Leconfield. There are playing fields, a cricket pitch, children's playground, tennis courts and a pavilion. See website.

Village Hall

The Village Hall is situated in Tillington near the pub and the church. The National Trust gave the Hall to the Parish Council on 9th August 1957 on a 99 year lease. It is looked after by a Management Committee. It is well used on a regular basis, and for one-off events, by many individuals, local groups and organisations. See website.

Cart Shed at Upperton

The Cart Shed was bought by the Parish Council from the Leconfield Estates on 7th March 1976 for the sum of £100. It is Grade 2 listed and is used as a parking area for Upperton residents' cars.
